THIS is not the first time Buntingford has ventured into a publication all its own. In 1923 "The Buntingford and North Herts Gazette" was established. It ran for seventeen years. Since then the town has relied on newspapers printed in Hertford and Royston for its local news and our coverage in these papers would seem to be fairly adequate.

IT is believed, however, by a small but enterprising group of Buntingfordians, that what is lacking in these publications is information relating specifically to life as it is led in Buntingford. "The Buntingford Journal" aims to provide this information in order to foster the good community spirit we have and to help everyone to enjoy the benefits and overcome the difficulties of living in this charming small town of ours.

WE do not aim to bring you news of past events so much as prior information of events to come, though there will be occasional news items that could be of interest in the light of coming events.

"THE Buntingford Journal" is being launched by The Buntingford Civic Society as a result of the closure of "Contact", the church-based magazine that was so efficiently run for many years by Mr. A. Powers. "Contact" was put through your door regularly and read with interest by church goers and non-church goers alike. As well as information on religious matters, it provided an essentially parish pump type information service and it is this latter community service we would like to try to continue.

THE Journal is particularly your magazine. If there is any information you would like to see in it, or

if your club or society wants to tout for more members or tell readers about any successful events it has held, all you have to do is write to, or telephone the Editor, (name and address on the back of the cover) and your items will be included in the next issue, or soon as space allows.

"LETTERS to the Editor" are also invited, on any topic connected with Buntingford and its environs about which you have strong opinions.

REGULAR features in "The Journal" will include theatre and cinema programmes, a Cinema Club programme, a Town Council feature and a "Bunta" cartoon. We would also have liked to make a regular feature of entries from the Buntingford Diary but when it came to making up a list of events for late-Dec/January, we found two entries! This Diary is intended as an aid to organisers of social occasions to help them to choose a date which does not conflict with other events planned, but if in future months it is worth while the "Journal" publishing a list, an entry in The Diary could get you extra publicity.

"THE Buntingford Journal" will be on shop counters during the first week of every month and we hope that you will consider it well worth the small charge of 3p.

THE Editor looks forward to receiving your contributions to the magazine, (about 200 words would be about right) and any suggestions as to the type of information you would like to see in the magazine in the coming months.

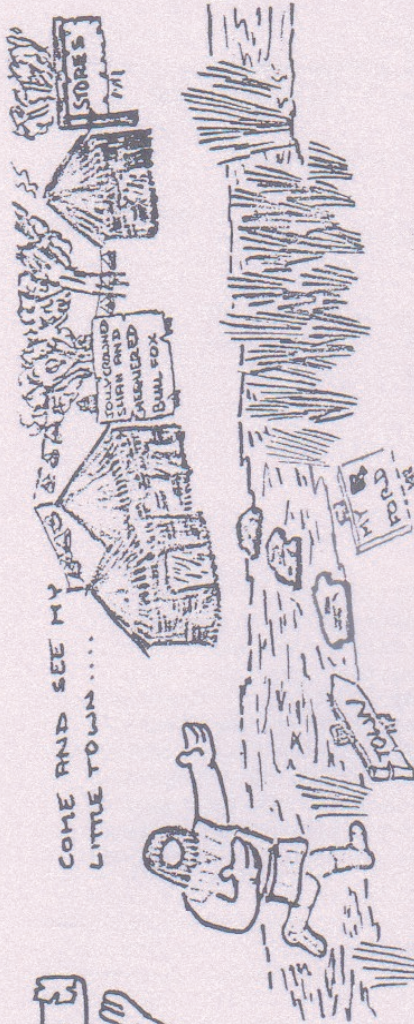

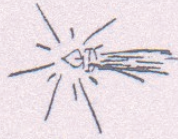

THE TOWN COUNCIL.

WHO are our Councillors and what do they do?

The duties of a Town Council look clear and simple on paper, but in reality must be very varied and complex. According to our Council's Chairman, apart from such cut-and-dried duties as footway lighting, playing fields, Layston Court Gardens and street sweeping, the Council deals with anything immediately connected with the Parish of Buntingford, or anything peculiar to the Parish of Buntingford. The Council is, he says, the body most in contact with the people and it can either take action itself, or pass problems on to the appropriate authority either District or County Council.

To get the Town Council to help with your problem you can either write to Mrs. V. Powell, the Clerk of the Council, at Bridgefoot House, or button-hole any member whenever or wherever you see him/her.

If you have sought help from the Town Council you can attend the next Council meeting and hear your problem being discussed, though you may not join in the discussion. The only time any of us can get up and tackle the Council direct, at a meeting, is at the Annual Council Meeting. It is always well advertised so you won't miss your opportunity.

It is also possible to attend Council committee meetings, though again, we may not speak at them.

There are two committees. The Open Spaces committee which deals with playing fields, Layston Court Gardens and any open area of the town, and the General Purposes Committee which deals with anything and everything that is thrown at it.

The idea of committees is that they take our problems in their raw state, sort out the facts and decide upon a solution. The committee members then take their solutions to the full Council meeting for the rest of the Councillors to take a vote on.

Next month the "Journal" will contain an article on what being a Councillor entails and how Council members are elected.

The Film Society Report

THE Buntingford Film Society, formed last Autumn has completed its first season. A few facts are worth reporting. 70 people joined; the maximum number at any showing was 60 persons, and the minimum number just 8, (though that was for a continental film.) The Society was £30 in credit at the end of the season.

THE Society is holding a general meeting on January 8th at which a film will be shown; coffee and biscuits will be available. This will be a free evening and all are invited.

THE Society will discuss the next season, January - April, and the Autumn season. At present about 24 films are booked for 1976, and it looks like a successful year coming up. A few ideas are - block memberships for organisations; O.A.P. special rates; special shows for groups. The Film Society needs your support.

BUSES to our nearest large towns are by no means frequent, but it is quite possible to get to Stevenage, Cambridge, Ware, Hertford and Hitchin for a few hours shopping using the buses. It may mean going without lunch, or making do with a quick coffee, but the times are fairly convenient for mothers with school age children, (the exception being the Cambridge bus when you will have to get someone to take care of them for 30 minutes or so.) Saturday timetables are not included as most families use their cars on that day.

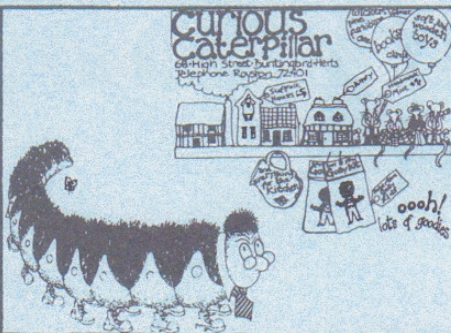

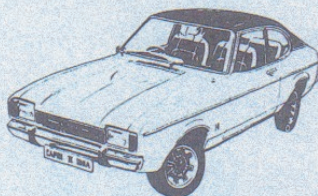
